




# Product quality and handling

As a major supplier of jet fuel, we understand the crucial importance of product quality and handling. Global supply chains are being extended to include mega refining complexes, typically in the Middle East and Asia, which now serve a large part of the mature markets in North America and Europe. The associated challenges are becoming more technical and demanding.

Vitol Aviation has the knowledge and infrastructure to ensure we handle and deliver timely, on spec products, across these increasingly complex supply chains. Furthermore, we ensure robustness of supply, through an extensive and diverse global network of jet fuel supply points, which include Vitol's own group refining capability, term supply contracts and spot avails.

The consistent investment of the Vitol Group in our refining, shipping, storage and jet handling facilities, as well as training and testing regimes, ensures our customers and partners benefit from our commitment to efficiently deliver the highest quality products.





### Logistical capabilities

Vitol has been trading jet fuel for over 30 years. As the world's largest independent trader of energy products it has established a unique supply infrastructure, from exploration, to refining, storage and shipping, which enables the group to respond swiftly and efficiently to market imbalances, and to bring value to the end user.

Logistics are at the core of our business. The strength and depth of our logistical capabilities enables us to manage external factors that may impact continuity of supply, from refinery outages to geo-political issues.

Our shipping and operations experts work side by side with product specialists to maximise efficiency and efficacy. With up to 100 vessels on long-term charter and circa 6,500 ship voyages each year, we have up to 250 ships transporting our cargoes at sea at any one time. Coupled with access to over 3 million tonnes of jet storage capacity, pipeline, barge, truck and train operations, this logistical expertise and product handling knowledge enables Vitol Aviation to consistently deliver value and excellence.

# Supplying the 7th continent

In December 2016 Vitol Aviation was appointed to supply jet fuel in the Antarctic. The challenging yet fragile environment of the region requires the highest standards in product quality, handling, engineering and logistical expertise. Temperatures can fall below -47°C (the maximum of the Defstan jet fuel spec) and both the fuel and infrastructure have to be able to withstand extreme conditions.

#### Journey to Antarctica

Vitol Aviation jet fuel was shipped in custombuilt containers from Cape Town to Antarctica where our team of experts, having earlier crossed the 650km Fimbul Ice Shelf, unloaded and transported the containers some 1,500km by snow cat. Once unloaded the containers were transferred to the newly constructed White Fang Runway (WFR) where jet fuel is held for commercial operations as well as for use in scientific projects and as emergency reserves. The environmental management and crucial fuel quality responsibilities remain under Vitol Aviation's constant supervision and management.

Vitol is an energy and commodities company. Its primary business is the trading and distribution of energy products globally. It trades over seven million barrels of crude oil and products every day and, at any time, has up to 250 ships transporting its cargoes at sea.

Founded over 50 years ago, today Vitol serves clients from some 40 offices worldwide and is invested in energy assets globally including almost 18mm³ of storage across seven continents, 480kbpd of refining capacity and circa 5,000 service stations across Africa, Australia, Eurasia and in Northwest Europe.

#### Aviation News

May 2018 - Following Vitol's investment in OVH Energy (OVH), Vitol Aviation is working with OVH's aviation division and can now provide jet fuel to its international customers at Lagos, Abuja and Kano in Nigeria.

June 2017 - Vitol acquired Petro Ofisi. Vitol Aviation is working with Petrol Ofisi's aviation division, PO Air, across its 20 locations in Turkey, enabling customers to benefit from an integrated international network with the highest operational standards.

December 2016 - Vitol acquired Shell's aviation assets in Australia through its Australian refining and retail network Viva Energy Australia. This addition to the Vitol Group's refining and logistics infrastructure has allowed Vitol Aviation to expand its network and global reach, which now includes access to a further 50 airports across Australia, where some 1,300 flights a day are refuelled.
